

Parental Awareness of Prose Literacy Grade 3 Elementary School in Semampiran Hamlet, Ketundan Village, Pakis District, Magelang Regency

Abstract

The purpose of this study was to determine the level of parental awareness of children's prose literacy in Semampiran Hamlet, Ketundan Village, Pakis District, Magelang Regency. This study uses a survey methodology. The data collection technique is the questionnaire value given by the researcher to the research subject. Based on the results of the data, it can be concluded that students have problems in their prose literacy. Parents do not fully support students in developing their literacy with the lack of storytelling mentoring activities. Children also experience limited and delayed reading activities. As a result, students have low reading comprehension and need time to understand a story text.

1. INTRODUCTION

Storytelling or storytelling is one of the oral language skills that elementary school students need to have. Because storytelling is a part of speaking skill. Storytelling skills are important to fulfill developmental tasks in speaking, not only in terms of communication skills. Storytelling is telling a fairy tale, which is a simple fantasy story that doesn't really happen which serves to convey moral teachings (educate) as well as to entertain. So, fairy tales are a form of literary work whose stories don't really happen/fictitious.

The age of elementary school children can be developed properly, according to the uniqueness and stage of development of the child's age. Based on (Zikmund, 1997) survey research method is a form of technique in which information is collected from a number of samples in the form of people, through questions. Based on (Gay & Diehl, 1992) survey research method is a method used as general category research using questionnaires and interviews, while according to (Bailey, 1982) survey research method is a research method in which data collection techniques are carried out through written or oral questions. Thus we can conclude that the survey research method is a method in which data collection can use questionnaires and interviews obtained from a sample of people, which of these data will be able to represent a certain population according to the interests of the research, both to find out who they are, what they are and what they are. what they think, feel, or tend to do.

In its implementation, the type of survey used is a cross sectional survey, namely research that collects data at one time to the sample (Creswell, 2012, p. 377). The selection of a cross sectional survey design was carried out to measure the behavior of a number of populations through a sample regarding the level of student academic integrity as a variable in the study. This is a consideration that the cross sectional survey is a survey design that is popularly used in education, and is used to collect information about attitudes, beliefs, opinions, and behaviors with the advantage of being able to present information in a short time. This type of cross-sectional survey can measure the need for educational services related to programs, school facilities, or involvement in schools or in the community (Creswell, 2012 p. 379). Therefore, this research can be used as information in the development of educational programs and services, especially in children's prose literacy to help achieve educational goals for students.

2. Literatur Review

2.1 Definition of Prose (Story)

Prose is a free literary work that is not bound by the number of words, syllables, or lines. Prose is also not tied to rhythm and rhyme like poetry. The word prose itself comes from the Latin "prose" which means "to be frank". Writing prose is usually used to express or describe facts or ideas.

Prose in literature is often referred to as fiction. The word prose is taken from English, namely prose. Prose or fiction has the meaning of a narrative work that tells something fictitious, imaginary, not based on reality or it can also mean a reality born based on fantasy. (Saputra & et al, 2021)

This activity is expected to improve children's reading skills and parents' awareness of the importance of storytelling to children. With this, it is hoped that it can help ease the burden on parents a little in dealing with the problems of children whose reading skills have not been handled during the distance learning period in Semampiran Hamlet, Ketundan Village, Pakis District, Magelang Regency.



There are several things that affect the low prose literacy of children in Semampiran Hamlet, one of which is because parents do not have enough time to tell stories to their children. parents are tired of their work and don't have much time even to play together. Another problem we found was the fact that the COVID-19 pandemic also affected parents' income which indirectly resulted in limited access to children's learning, such as not having a smartphone or computer to writing tools. In addition, there are also factors from the area of residence that make internet access more difficult and the limited space that can be used by students and teachers in carrying out learning, especially prose literacy material.



5. CONCLUSION

The results of this activity indicate that the people of Semampiran Hamlet, Ketundan Village, Pakis District, Magelang Regency are less supportive of storytelling mentoring activities for children who experience reading delays. This activity is expected to improve children's reading skills and parents' awareness of the importance of storytelling to children. With this, it is hoped that it can help ease the burden on parents in dealing with children's problems that have not been handled by reading skills during the distance learning period in Semampiran Hamlet, Ketundan Village, Pakis District, Magelang Regency.

The second meeting was filled with reading comprehension, which began with storytelling and continued at the third meeting on reading comprehension. exams or tests on students. After providing assistance, it was found that students in Semampiran Hamlet, Ketundan Village, Pakis Subdistrict, Magelang Regency already had the ability to read. As for writing skills, students in Semampiran Hamlet, Ketundan Village, Pakis District, Magelang Regency are still lacking. They are also less able to identify some elements in prose. exams or tests on students.

It can be concluded that the low awareness of parents towards understanding literacy in children causes children's reading and writing skills to also be low. This can be seen from the increase in the average score of children after receiving some assistance.

The low level of parental awareness of prose literacy can be caused by several things, such as the lack of parental understanding of the benefits of prose literacy and the lack of communication between parents and children.
